











**Chart No: 2 Teachers Preparation for the Classes** 



How well were the teachersable to communicate



Chart No: 4 **Teachers' approach towards teaching** 










Mentoring process facilitates Social and Emotional growth





Quality improvement of the teaching learning proces









Teachers Preparation for the Classes



Teachers Communication Skills



Teachers approach towards teaching



Fairness of the internal evaluation process











